A capacity audience enjoyed another wonderful **Longcroft Production** as pupils and Sixth Form students performed **'Everyone's Talking About Jamie'** - a stage musical centred around sixteen year old Jamie New.

We were delighted and proud to welcome **Graham Stuart MP** to our school. It was wonderful to celebrate together our children, our school and the Wonder Learning Partnership's fantastic achievements over recent years, as well as to share our vision for sustained educational excellence in the locality moving forward.

A group of Lower School pupils, known as the **Longcroft Green Team**, took on the role of Active Travel Ambassadors with the aim of helping our environment by encouraging members of the Longcroft community to favour active means of travelling to and from school such as cycling and walking.

Recognising the challenge of encouraging people to switch to sustainable travel has never been greater and more important; we are delighted to be working in partnership with **Modeshift** – the UK's leading sustainable travel organisation.

Our Green Team enjoyed the opportunity to visit County Hall in Beverley where they pitched their campaign to a panel of industry experts including Jenny Wiles from Active Travel England.


The pupils certainly made an impact on the panel of judges. Mr Coupe explained, "While pupils were pitching to receive £250, the panel were impressed and awarded them £500! I am sure our Ambassadors, who did an amazing job, will invest their money wisely and succeed in their aim of both encouraging and supporting active travel."

Former Longcroft student **Becky Briggs** completed an incredible, inspirational comeback from a serious injury when she completed the London Marathon. Becky, who represented Great Britain in Munich's 2022 European Championships, earned a fabulous 12th place in the Elite Women's race in a time of 2:35:25. She explained: "16 months ago, I started running again from scratch after 3 months off recovering from bilateral sacral stress fractures. On Sunday I finished the London Marathon as the English National Champion and second Brit."









Four Longcroft pupils, Ella (Year 11), Hailey (Year 10), Ava (Year 9) and Poppy (Year 8) competed for their **BDC Royals** team from former student Clare Moran's Base Dance Company at the UDO British Competition. The team secured first place to become the British Champions in their team dance category for the second consecutive year! They are looking forward to representing Britain in the UDO World Street Dance Championships in August.



Former student **Laura Meredith**, whose acting career has included roles in Coronation Street, Casualty and Hullraisers, starred in Hull theatre company Middle Child's highly acclaimed production of Maureen Lennon's 'Baby, He Loves You'. Laura said: "I loved playing Jodie in 'Baby, He Loves You'. It was a really important story — I found the response of the audience and speaking to them afterwards really fulfilling. Playing the lead was an exciting challenge."

Year 7 pupil **Oscar Harling** competed in the North East England Regional Swimming Championships, earning 8th place in the final of the 50 metres breaststroke.



Year 8 pupil **Amelia** gained valuable publicity for the campaign she is leading to increase the use of cycle helmets and change the law. BBC reporter Amanda White interviewed Amelia, along with her cousin Sophia, best friend Billie and her mum VJ, for a feature which aired on Look North. Amelia said: "It was really good. I enjoyed it and was glad I got on TV. Amanda was really happy I was doing it. She thought I was really brave and that I was doing a good thing."





It was wonderful to welcome **Alison Wilson, the DfE's Regional Director for Yorkshire and the Humber,** to
Longcroft. Pupils and Sixth Form students met Alison,
one of the most senior officials in the Department for
Education, who was hugely impressed by our young
people. They discussed their school, their education, and
a range of issues affecting young people nationally.

Year 12 students held a bake sale, raising £111 for the Peel Project in Hull. **The Peel Project** is a charitable organisation that supports the local community with a focus on the BAME population in our area. Year 12 learnt about this when Imam Choudhury visited the Sixth Form to talk about the work of the Islamic community in East Yorkshire.





Our **Year 10 football team** enjoyed a fantastic season which culminated in them reaching the Humberside Schools' Cup Final – unfortunately despite a valiant effort the girls were beaten in the final against Howden School at Hull's St Mary's College.

Having retired from professional rugby league months earlier, former student **Scott Taylor** completed the Rob Burrow Leeds Marathon, raising over £2,500 to support friends and MND sufferers Rob Burrow and Craig Eskrett. Having completed the course, he said: "I gave it my all and the main thing was to finish it. Unfortunately my body let me down but I battled round in just over five hours to the finish. I always wanted to do it faster but it was about raising money for two true gents and I hit my target." Former Longcroft student **Katy Beskow** visited to talk to Year 10 pupils about the joys of being a food writer, and why veganism is so important to her. Pupils also watched Katy create a mouth-watering vegan pasta dish, had a stimulating Q & A session, and learned about the cookery publishing business.











Year 11 pupil **Harry** combined his studies at Longcroft with a day each week at Beverley's East Riding College. Harry's tutor Jeremy Hara explained: "Harry completed stretch and challenge work in the form of building an arch. Normally a Level 1 student would not get the chance to build a complex wall, however Harry has exhibited the dedication, skill and passion for the craft and showed meticulous attention to detail." Harry was nominated for an award as 'The Best 14 – 16 Student in the College' and we were proud and delighted when he won! Harry is pictured receiving his award at the College's Awards Ceremony.

Mr Coupe and Mrs Newsam took twelve pupils to Dalby Forest for a mountain bike experience expedition. Prior to the trip, the pupils received two afternoons of training from the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Sustainable Transport Team in order to build up their mountain biking skills.

On a day that will live long in the memories of everyone involved with the club, Beverley won 58-33.

Our athletes took on schools from across the county in the Humberside round of the **ESAA Schools' Cup** at Hull's Costello Stadium.

Former Longcroft pupil **Tallulah Pulling** represented her country in the prestigious Tri-nations tournament. The annual tournament, which this year took place in Cardiff, sees the best boxers from England, Scotland and Wales compete against each other. Tallulah, who represents Beverley's Track Fitness and Boxing Club, took on Scottish boxer Isabella Fioretti and was unfortunate to lose out on a 3:2 split decision.

Pupils recognised that the rise of a new gentry class and a move away from the previously defence-oriented homes of the rich allowed a successful burgeoning capitalist England to take the opportunity to broadcast their social status.

Year 12 Biologists enjoyed visiting **Cranedale Residential Centre** for a three day field trip. The residential included visits to Filey Brigg where students looked at salinity, temperature and abundance of seaweed, Brompton and Settringham Becks to study the index of diversity in two streams and Wharram Quarry to study the different stages of succession, looking at soil pH, soil depth, temperature, humidity and plant species richness to determine the different series of succession. Students also set some live mammal traps, camera traps and pitfall traps and studied their findings.

Our musicians were proud to provide an evening of musical entertainment at Leconfield's beautiful St Catherine's Church.



Anika said: "There were so many amazing cultural sights highlights were Park Guell and Sagrada Família."




A coach load of tired pupils and Sixth Form students boarded the bus home having had a wonderful experience and looking forward to next year!

'Weaving Dreams'

A wonderful year culminated in a celebration to mark the publishing of our fourth Anthology. First Story believes everyone has a unique voice, a story to tell and a right to be heard. The charity supports young people to practise creative writing for pleasure, self-expression and agency; their flagship programme sees inspirational professional writers work to develop creativity, confidence and ability. A group of pupils worked with Ms Carvill and First Story Writer-in-Residence Vicky Foster to produce 'Weaving Dreams', a stunning collection of poetry and writing through which they have demonstrated tremendous talent and maturity as authors.

Ms Carvill said: "Our wonderful cohort of First Story writers marked the publication of Longcroft's new anthology with a book launch party attended by family and friends. The festivities began with pupils proudly posing for photos with their new anthologies, and the certificates awarded to them for completing the Young Writers Programme. The celebratory mood was enhanced by guitar and vocals performed by gifted Year 10 musician Joe Dawson. A huge thank you to Joe for creating such a joyous ambience."



Weaving Dreams, Longcroft's fourth anthology is its most eclectic to date. It features poetry and prose by pupils and students across year groups, with a spectrum of abilities, and from a variety of backgrounds. The book is all the richer for it. As Ms Carvill commented:

"When our 2023/2024 cohort was formed it felt incredibly important that it was all inclusive, reflecting the diversity of pupils and students that make up our wonderful school."

Ali Johnson, First Story Programme & Partnership Manager (Yorkshire) described the anthology as:

"Rich, packed with individuality, spark and creativity."

He added:

"You have explored different themes, forms and styles, creating a brilliant showcase of exciting new writing. Not only will Longcroft School Library have another anthology to add to the collection, but First Story will also be sending a copy to the British Library so that your words can be enjoyed for the rest of time."

Weaving Dreams truly invites the reader into the minds of its creators. It's a world awash with colours, scents, flowers; of light and dark, moonstones, fantasy, springtime, birds and trees.

Our inspirational writer in residence, Vicky Foster, felt very satisfied that having shared one of her own poems about how a tree could represent her adolescent life, a number of pupils put forward their interpretations for the anthology. Indeed, one of them read her poem about a tree out at the launch party.





It was thrilling to see her and so many of our young writers perform their work to an audience, and to recognise how much their confidence has grown as a result of their First Story Programme experience.

Our cohort should feel incredibly proud that they are all published authors and that a copy of their anthology is in the British Library. To have work published at such a young age is a massive achievement. It also takes a huge amount of courage.

Momentous thanks to Ms George, our Food Technology teacher, and all her budding Year 10 chefs, for providing such a delicious buffet to help celebrate and make the party such a success.

Well done to everyone involved - we look forward to applying once again in 2025!












Our Wonderful FOLS Celebrate a Successful Year!
